

Ordinance of M Sc Medical

1. Scope:

This ordinance shall apply to the programme leading to M Sc Medical Degree in the following Medical subjects.

- I. Medical Anatomy
- II. Medical Physiology
- III. Medical Biochemistry
- IV. Medical Microbiology
- V. Medical Pharmacology

2. Eligibility for Admission:

- a. A candidate seeking admission to the M Sc Medical programme must be a citizen of India, should have passed 3 years undergraduate program (B. Sc) scoring 50% marks in aggregate without grace (45% for SC/ ST) and having Biological Sciences as one of the subjects or MBBS, BDS, BAMS or BHMS or BPT or B. Pharma or BMLT, BMRIT, B.Sc (Nursing) or any other professional graduates from a recognized University in Science stream only.
- b. Admission shall be made once in an academic year.
- c. A candidate shall have to be medically fit.
- d. A student can be granted provisional admission in case the result of qualifying examination is awaited. However in such case, candidate shall ensure to produce copy of result before 30th Nov of the admission year or any other date notified/ decided by the University.

3. Admission:

- a. Admission to these programmes shall be made based on merit of entrance test conducted by the University or as approved by the Vice Chancellor.
- b. Admission to the programme shall be made once a year and the last date for admission shall be 30th September of the admission year.
- c. A candidate with MBBS and BDS qualification shall be eligible for lateral entry to the program and admission shall be made in 2nd year directly.

4. Programme Duration:

The total duration of M.Sc. Medical course will be 3 years which is divided into three academic years.

The maximum period for completion of programme successfully by a candidate shall not exceed six years.

5. Annual Intake

The number of students admitted shall be as approved by the executive council of the university.

6. Medium of Instruction

The medium of instruction for all subjects of study and examination shall be English.

7. Organization of Programme

- a) The period from 1st October to 30th September shall constitute one academic year. Each academic year is divided into two semesters. There shall be 37 weeks devoted for the academic activities excluding internal and university examination and their preparatory leaves in an academic year.

- b) The course delivery in each academic year shall be carried out in accordance with the minimum hours assigned to each subject and allied activities.

8. Program Curriculum

- a) The first year shall include study of basic medical subjects- Anatomy, Physiology and Biochemistry and shall be common for all the subjects.
- b) In the second year and third year, academic activities shall lead to study the topics of respective subject (theory and practical), teaching exposure and dissertation. In addition, student will undertake study of the subjects "Research Methodology" during 2nd year and the "Teaching Methodology" during 3rd year.
- c) After completion of first year academic activities, the candidate will be assigned a supervisor. The supervisor in consultation with Principal/Dean of medical faculty shall assign a research topic to the candidate. The student shall carryout work on the topic under the supervisor assigned.
- d) The dissertation work shall be submitted six months before the commencement of final year examination with the condition that the candidate has cleared all the subjects of second year.
- e) **TEACHING EXPOSURE:** In order to get the teaching experience, students shall be assigned theory and practical classes for paramedical and other allied health science students. The performance shall be part of internal assessment.

9. Attendance:

- a. Student is normally required to attend all theory and practical classes of every subject and also the curricular and co-curricular activities.
- b. A student must have minimum of 75% attendance in theory and practical in each subject.
- c. A student, who fails to achieve the prescribed minimum attendance, shall not be allowed to appear in the University Examination and shall be deemed to have been detained.
- d. In special circumstances, short fall in attendance can be condoned to the extent of 5% by the Principal. If the short fall is more than 5 %, the Principal may recommend the case to the Vice Chancellor for condonation. The decision of Vice Chancellor shall be final.
- e. The attendance of student shall be reckoned from the date of admission / commencement of classes whichever is later.
- f. In case a student is found absent from the classes continuously for a period of 20 days or more without prior sanction, student shall be issued notice for striking off his / her name from rolls. In such cases, to resume classes he/she shall have to apply for re-admission within 10 days from the date of issue of the notice. Re- admission shall be subject to approval by the Vice Chancellor and shall be affected only on payment of prescribed re-admission fees.

10. Syllabi

The syllabi of the program containing subject wise contents and teaching scheme phase / semester wise with delivery methods shall be published separately.

11. Evaluation Scheme

- a) A student's performance will be evaluated through end year University Examination and continuous assessment. The University examination shall be held at the end of each

academic year and a continuous assessment of theory and practical shall also be made based on student performance in the Class-Tests, assignments, participation in co-curricular activities etc.

b) The distribution of marks for the subjects shall be as per the year evaluation scheme, depicted below.

Note : Contents / Topics of the subjects have to be earmarked and defined paper wise for subject delivery as well as for question paper setting.

12. Examination

a) The University shall hold examinations for the academic programme, as per prescribed Schemes of Teaching and Examinations and Syllabi.

- b) In an academic year university shall conduct two examinations. The main examination shall be held at the end of the academic year and the supplementary examination within three months of declaration of main examination result.
- c) A student not qualifying in the theory and or practical shall be required to re-appear in both theory and practical examination.
- d) A candidate who fails to clear one or more subjects of first year shall appear in the subsequent examinations to clear the subject/subjects. A candidate will be allowed to appear in the Final year Examination only if he/she has cleared all the subjects of first and second year examination.
- e) The dissertation shall be evaluated by examiners appointed by the University and followed by Viva-Voce. Acceptance of dissertation work is an essential precondition for a candidate to appear in the final year University examination.

13. Examiners:

a) Theory Paper-

For **first year examination** for each subject Papers I will be set by the external examiner & Paper II by the Internal Examiner. For evaluation, Paper I will be evaluated by the external examiner & Paper II by the internal examiner.

For **second year examination**: Out of three papers, two papers will be set and evaluated by external examiner and the third paper will be set and evaluated by the internal examiner.

For **third year examination**: Out of three papers, two papers will be set and evaluated by external examiner and the third paper will be set and evaluated by the internal examiner.

b) Practical and viva /oral

The practical and Viva examination shall be conducted by a team of two Examiners out of which one examiner will be external and other will be internal

c) Dissertation Evaluation

Evaluation of dissertation will be done by two examiners one internal and the other external from any university within the state.

14. Qualifying Standards:

- Minimum pass marks for the subject is 50% in theory and practical separately.
- A student declared fail in a subject shall have to appear in both the theory and practical of the subject.
- A student shall have maximum of four attempts to clear a subject. In case he/she fails to clear the subject then he/she shall have to appear in all the subjects of that year.

15. Promotions

- A student having appeared in the examination of an academic year shall be permitted to take up the academic activities of the next academic year irrespective of performance of previous year.
- A student shall be allowed to appear in final year examination only after having cleared all the subjects of first and second year.

- A student shall be allowed to submit the dissertation work provided he/ she has cleared all the subjects of first year.

16. Grace Marks :

- a) A student who does not satisfy on his own, the qualifying standards prescribed can be awarded 'Grace Marks' not exceeding a maximum 5 marks which can be shared by theory and practical limited to one subject only and shall be declared as pass with grace marks. However the grace marks shall not be part of the grand total.

17. Results:

- a) The examination result of a student shall be declared separately for each year which will indicate the status of his performance.
- b) The final result for declaring division and award of degree shall be prepared on the basis of cumulative performance of the student in all three years.

18. Award of Division:

- a) Division shall be awarded on the basis of final result.
- b) Division will not be awarded for candidates passing any of the examination in more than one attempt or invoked grace marks in any examination.
- c) A student shall be declared pass in :
 - 'First Division with Honors' if he/she secures 75% or more marks in program grand total, provided, passed all examinations in first attempt without invoking any grace marks.
 - 'First Division' if secures 60 % or more marks in programme grand total, provided, passed all examinations in first attempt without invoking any grace marks.
 - 'Second Division' if secures 50% or more marks in programme grand total, provided, passes all examination in first attempt without invoking any grace marks.
 - Pass, if student has passed any or all examinations in the supplementary examination.
 - 'Pass with Grace', if he/ she has passed any examination invoking grace marks.

19. Scrutiny

- i) Scrutiny shall be allowed in only theory papers. Student can apply for maximum of two subjects for scrutiny.
- ii) Re-evaluation is not permitted.

20. Award of degree:

The student shall be eligible for award of M Sc Medical degree on successful completion of prescribed course of study and have been declared pass in the final result.

21. Power to Amend the Ordinance

The 'Executive Council' shall have the powers to relax, amend any or all the provisions of the Ordinances, on the recommendation of Academic Council of the University. However amendment shall not be in contravention of the guidelines and directives of any statutory body.

This ordinance shall apply to the programme leading to M Sc. (Master of Science) Medical in following specialization.

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- II. Medical Physiology
- III. Medical Biochemistry
- IV. Medical Microbiology
- V Medical Pharmacology

2. Eligibility for Admission:

- a. A candidate seeking admission to the M Sc Medical programme must be a citizen of India should have passed 3 years undergraduate program (B. Sc) scoring 50% marks in aggregate without grace (45% for SC/ ST) and having Biological Sciences as one of the subject or MBBS , BDS, BAMS or BHMS or BPT or B. Pharm or BMLT, BMRIT , B Sc (Nursing) or any other professional graduates from a recognized University.
- b. Admission shall be made once in a academic year.
- c. A candidate shall have to be medically fit.
- d. A student can be granted provisional admission in case of result of qualifying examination is waited. However in such case , candidate shall ensure to produce copy of result before 30th Nov or any other date notified/ decide.

3. Admission:

- a. Admission to these programme shall be made based on merit of entrance test conducted or as approved by Vice Chancellor
- b. Admission to programme shall be made only in 1st year and last date for admission shall be 30th September of the admission year.

4. Programme Duration:

The total duration of M.Sc. Medical course will be 3 years which is divided into two phases of total 6 semesters.

The First Phase shall consists of two semesters (1st & 2nd) and Second Phase shall consists 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th semester.

The maximum period for completion of programme successfully by a candidates shall not exceed six years.

5. Annual Intake

The number of students shall be admitted as approved by the executive council of the university.

6. Medium of Instruction

The medium of instruction for all subjects of study and examination shall be English.

7. Organization of Programme

- a) The period 1st October to 30th September shall constitute one academic year. Each academic year is divided in to two semester. There shall be 37 weeks devoted for the academic activities excluding internal and university examination and their preparation leave.

b) The course delivery in each academic year shall be carried out in accordance the minimum hours assigned to each subject and allied activities.

8. Program Curriculum

- a) The first phase shall include study of basic medical subjects- Anatomy, Physiology and Biochemistry and shall be common for all the specialization.
- b) In the second phase, academic activities shall lead to study the topics of respective specialization (theory and practical), teaching exposure and dissertation.
- c) Student shall carryout research work on the topic assigned under the supervisor assigned. The dissertation shall be submitted six month before the commencement of final examination.
- d) All student will also be assigned supervisor in the beginning of phase II and dissertation topic will be assigned by the supervisor in consultation of Principal/ dean of medical faculty.
- e) The dissertation work shall commence only after approval of the protocol.
- f) The dissertation shall be submitted six month before the final year examination.
- g) **TEACHING EXPOSURE:** In order to get the teaching experience, students shall be assigned to take theory and practical classes for paramedical and other allied health science students. The performance shall be part of internal assessment .

9. Attendance:

- a. Student is normally required to attend all theory and practical classes of every subject and also the curricular and co-curricular activities.
- b. A student must have minimum 75% attendance in theory and practical in each subject.
- c. A student, who fails to achieve the prescribed minimum attendance, shall not be allowed to appear in the Examination and, shall be deemed to have been detained.
- d. In special circumstances, short fall in attendance can be condoned on case's merit to the extent of 5% by the Principal. If the short fall is more than 5 %, the Principal may recommend on case's merit to the Vice Chancellor for condonation. The decision of Vice Chancellor shall be final.
- e. The attendance of student shall be reckoned from the date of admission / commencement of classes whichever is later.
- f. In case a student is found abstain from the classes continuously for a period of 20 days or more without prior sanction, student shall be issued notice for striking off his / her name from rolls. In such cases, to resume classes shall apply for re-admission within 10 days from the date of issue of the notice. The , student shall apply for re-admission. Re- admission shall be subject to approval and shall be affected only on payment of prescribed re-admission fees.

10. Syllabi

The syllabi of the program containing subject wise contents and teaching scheme phase / semester wise with delivery method shall be published separately.

11. Evaluation Scheme

- a) A student's performance will be evaluated through end term University Examination and continuous assessment. The University examination shall be held at the end of each academic phase of theory and practical and the continuation assessment of theory and practical shall also be made based on student performance in the Class-Tests, assignments, participation in co-curricular activities etc.

b) The distribution of marks for the subjects shall be as per the evaluation scheme.

There shall be at least two examiners in each subject. Out of them one shall be external examiner and one shall be internal examiner.

Phase II

Final Year Examination shall consist of Theory, practical and viva.

a. Theory examination consists of three papers-

Paper -I: 100 marks of 3 hrs

Paper II: 100 marks of 3 hrs

Paper III: 100 marks of 3 hrs

A strict division of subjects may not be possible. Some overlapping of topics is inevitable.

Students should be prepared to answer the overlapping topics.

B. Practical - 200 marks,

C. Viva - Voce - 100 marks

12. Examination

- The University shall hold examinations for the academic programme, as per prescribed Schemes of Teaching and Examinations and Syllabi.
- In a academic year university shall be conducted two examination. The main examination shall be held at the end of the academic year and the supplementary examination within three months of declaration of main examination result.
- A student not qualified in the theory or practical, shall be required to re-appear in both theory and practical examination.
- A candidate who failed to clear one or more subjects of first year will appear in the subsequent examinations to clear subject. A candidate will be allowed to appear in the Final year Examination only if he/she has passed the first year examination.
- The dissertation shall be valued by examiners appointed by the University. Acceptance of dissertation work is an essential precondition for a candidate to appear in the University examination.

13. Examiners:

a) Theory Paper-

For First year each subject, Papers I & Paper II will be set by one external examiner and other by the internal examiner and the evaluation will be done by one paper by external and other by external examiner.

Final year : Out of three papers, two paper will be set by external and one by internal examiner and for the evaluation at least one external examiner will be involved.

b) Practical and viva /oral

The practical and Viva examination shall be conducted by a team in the two Examiners out of which one examiner will be external and other will be internal

c) Dissertation Evaluation

Evaluation of dissertation will be done by two examiners one from any university within the state and other examiner from any University outside the state.

14. Qualifying Standards:

- Minimum pass marks for the subject is 50% in theory and practical separately.
- A student declared fail in a subject shall have to appear in both the theory and practical of the subject.
- A student shall have maximum two attempts to clear a subject. In case he/she fails to clear, shall be required to appear in all the subjects of the first year.

15. Promotions

- All student having appeared in the first year examination shall take the academic activities of Phase II irrespective of first year result.
- A student shall be allowed to submit dissertation provided he/ she has cleared all the subjects of first year.
- A student shall be allowed to appear in final year examination only after acceptance of dissertation.

16. Grace Marks :

a) A student who does not satisfy on his own, the qualifying standards prescribed can be awarded 'Grace Marks' not exceeding a maximum 5 marks which can be shared by theory and practical limited to one subject only shall be declared as pass with grace marks. However the grace marks shall not be part of the grand total.

17. Results:

a) The examination result of a student shall be declared separately for each phase part which will indicate the status of his performance of the academic year.

b) The final result for declaring division and award of degree shall be prepared on the basis of cumulative performance of student in phase I and phase II .

18. Award of Division:

- a) Division shall be awarded on the basis of final result.
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- c) A student shall be declared pass in :
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- Pass , If student has passed any or all examination in supplementary.
- 'Pass with Grace' , if he/ she has passed any examination invoking grace marks.

19. Scrutiny

- i) Scrutiny shall be allowed in only theory papers and student can apply for maximum ~~to~~ ^{1/2} subject .
- ii) In no case Re-evaluation is not permitted.

20. Award of degree:

The student shall be eligible for award of M Sc Medical degree on successful completion of prescribed course of study and have been declared pass in the final result.

21. Power to Amend the Ordinance

The 'Executive Council ' shall have the powers to relax, amend any or all the provisions of the Ordinances, on the recommendation of Academic Council of the University. However amendment shall not be in contravention of guidelines and directives of any statutory body .

D. Qualifying Standards:
